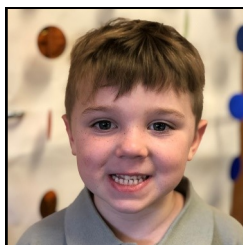

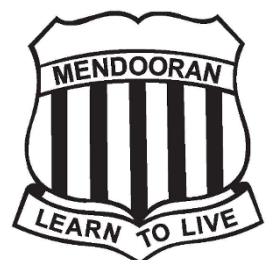

Technology News

As the school is embracing all the new technology we have implemented this year and the teaching staff getting better at utilising it, a lot of our subjects are now using Google Classroom to assign and publish student work.

A new feature has been added to the Google Classroom called "**Google Guardians**" where the parents and carers of students can sign up to receive notifications about their students work in class.

Essentially what happens is this. You supply the school with a Gmail address and are added as a guardian for your student. When you accept the invitation as a guardian you will then receive information by email on the following:

- Upcoming work—Work that's due today and tomorrow (for daily emails) or work that's due in the upcoming week (for weekly emails)
- Missing work—Work that's late at the time the email was sent
- Class activity—Announcements, assignments, and questions recently posted by teachers

It's a great way to keep track of your students work, make sure they are submitting their assignments and see what your students are engaged in for each subject.

At the moment we are in the trial phase before rolling this out across the school, so if you would like to take part please contact Mr Newberry at the school via the Front Office.

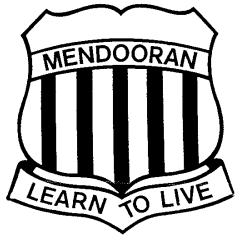

Public Speaking Competition

Mendooran Annual Public Speaking Competition

Our whole school Public Speaking Competition is running for the fourth year this term. A range of topics have been set for each stage and these are listed on the following page.

The purpose of our school wide competition is to develop confidence in the children with their skills in presenting before a peer audience.

Every child from Kinder to Year 10 is expected to present a speech. Students will be given some class time to prepare their speeches but the majority of their speech will need to be written at home. Public speaking strategies will be discussed in classes.

Students will have until the beginning of Week 5 Term 1 to prepare a speech, selecting from one of the topics listed.

The length of speeches will be:

- 1 minute** for Kindergarten to Year 2 (15 seconds either side is acceptable)
- 2 minutes** for Years 3-6 (15 seconds either side is acceptable)
- 3 minutes** for Years 7-8 (15 seconds either side is acceptable)
- 4 minutes** for Years 9-10 (15 seconds either side is acceptable)

Throughout Weeks 5, 6 & 7 of Term 1, speeches will be presented in class groups and semi-finalists chosen from each class. Semi-finals will then be held for teachers to select 2 finalists per stage.

At a special assembly on **Wednesday 27th March, (Week 9) in the COLA at 11:10am**, all finalists will present their speeches before the school and a panel of judges. Parents are invited to attend.

Information has been included to assist you and your children to prepare their speeches. ***No props, gimmicks or costumes are to be used.*** Palm cards and notes are allowed.

Teachers are looking forward to listening to some wonderful speeches.

PUBLIC SPEAKING – GENERAL ADVICE

The following general advice about public speaking includes information condensed from “Taking the Initiative – A Guide to Debating and Public Speaking, Revised Edition, 1999, NSW DET.”

PREPARATION

SUBJECT – This is chosen from the topic list given. Children should choose one that they are comfortable with and know the most about.

PURPOSE – This is what the children want the audience to think. It could be:

- To tell the audience about something
- To make them think the same way as the speaker
- To get them to feel the same way as the speaker
- To make them understand something
- To tell them feelings about something

Remember this is not news time. **Children don't bring something to show.** They have to use only words to tell the audience about their subject. **Think** – will the individual be most comfortable with palm cards and/or a small list of ideas or pictures to help remember what they want to say?

SPEAKERS WILL BE JUDGED UNDER THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA:

STRUCTURE AND CONTENT (Method and Matter)

Introduction – This should gain attention and help connect with the audience. The introduction might include the title of your speech (but not in a way such as 'Today my topic is...'); a question that will be answered in the middle of the speech; a startling opinion, fact or statement or a real life example.

Development (body) – In the body the speaker gets their message across. Include a few well-explained ideas or arguments that support the topic and purpose of your speech. The points should be linked together. Don't recite them like a list. A humorous story can be used but not overdone.

Conclusion – Never end with just “Thank you” or “That's all”. Find a way to conclude the speech that sums up what has been presented in the speech.

PERFORMANCE (Manner) - The following aspects of manner are considered:

- Gesture and Stance – These should be natural and relaxed without being sloppy. Gestures should be appropriate to the meaning and tone of what is being said and not unnatural or repetitive. For example, hands could be upturned in a questioning manner. Speakers should try to avoid distracting mannerisms.
- Visual Expression – Facial expressions should support the content of the speech.
- Eye Contact with the audience is vital so reading from notes should be kept to a minimum.
- Vocal Variation – Appropriate variations in pitch, pace, pause and volume add interest to a speech and create emphasis.

2019 Public Speaking Competition

Round one of our annual Public Speaking Competition has kicked off this week throughout K-10. It is important that our students ensure they have practised their speeches and are ready to present when their name is called. I would like to take a moment to outline why we encourage our students to participate in events such as this.

Firstly, the ability to be able to speak in front of people is a life skill. Whether they choose a profession that requires them to speak to groups of people or not, does not deflect from this. The ability to speak to people can be applied in the work place, at their best friend's wedding, at their own graduation and so on.

Secondly, the topics chosen require students to argue a side. This enhances their ability to write persuasive texts. The skill to complete a formal piece of writing has the potential to make their schooling life successful.

Thirdly, the tasks our students are set are based on the syllabus requirements. The syllabus outcomes for the Public Speaking Competition are stated below:

Early Stage 1: 1A - communicates with peers and known adults in informal and guided activities demonstrating emerging skills of group interaction

Stage 1: 1A - communicates with a range of people in informal and guided activities demonstrating interaction skills and considers how own communication is adjusted in different situations

Stage 2: 1A - communicates in a range of informal and formal contexts by adopting a range of roles in group, classroom, school and community contexts

Stage 3: 1A - communicates effectively for a variety of audiences and purposes using increasingly challenging topics, ideas, issues and language forms and features

Stage 4: 3B - uses and describes language forms, features and structures of texts appropriate to a range of purposes, audiences and contexts

Stage 5: 3B - selects and uses language forms, features and structures of texts appropriate to a range of purposes, audiences and contexts, describing and explaining their effects on meaning

Good luck to all our students! I look forward to the finals.

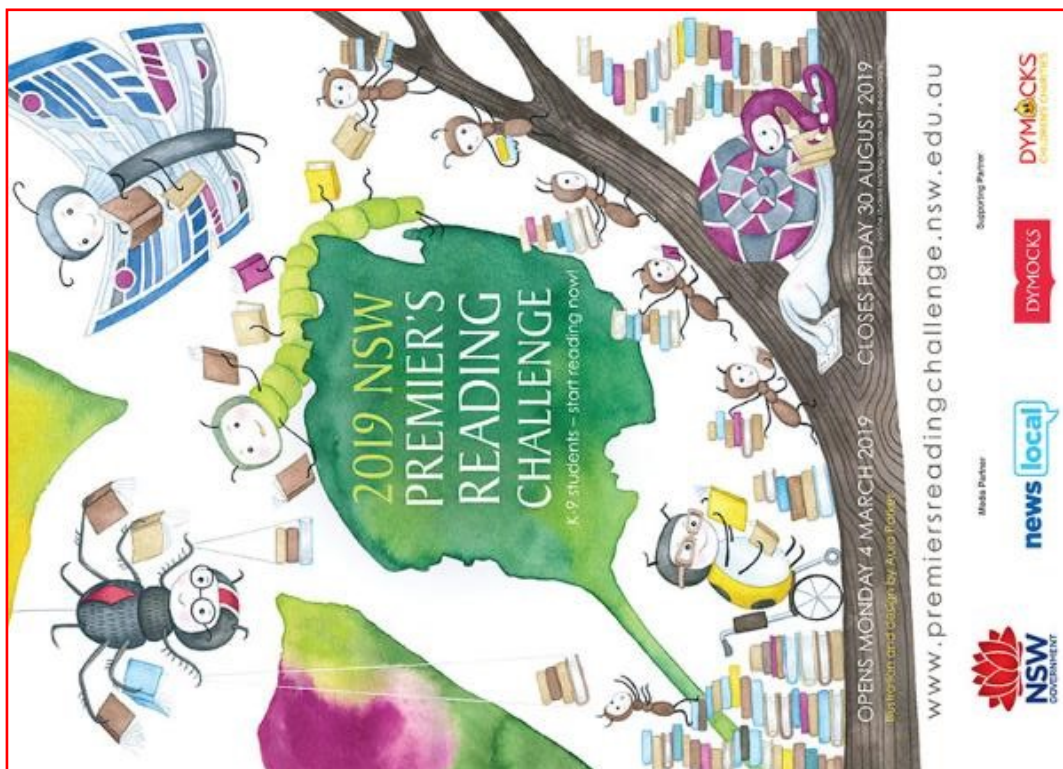

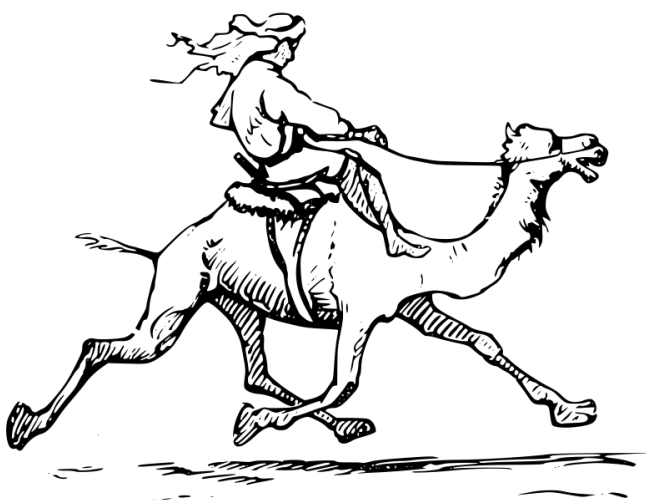

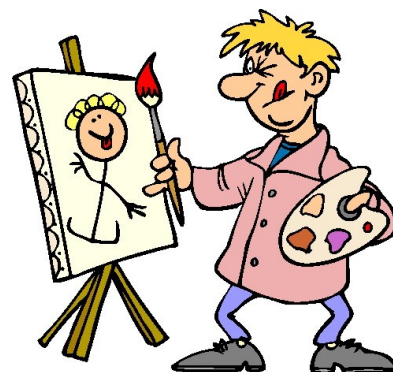
